

Preface

The Office of Institutional Planning and Research is responsible for providing data to internal and external constituents. Each academic year a large number of reports are generated by this office with the primary purpose of providing information integral for decision making and to promote a general awareness of the University. The University offers 30 bachelors, 8 masters, and a PhD program through four schools and one division: the School of Agriculture, Fisheries and Human Sciences (SAFHS); the School of Business and Management (SBM); the School of Education (SOE); the School of Arts and Sciences (SAS); and the Division of University College. Contained in this document are the institution's abbreviated history, mission and vision statements, historical enrollment trends, the retention and graduation rates of cohort groups of first-time full-time degree seeking students, applicant information, degrees conferred, employee data and tuition and mandatory fee costs.

History

The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff is the second oldest state-supported institution of higher education in Arkansas, one of only two with a land-grant mission, and the only public historically black college or university. It was created in 1873 by an act of the legislature as a branch of the Arkansas Industrial University. Originally known as Branch Normal College, the school opened on September 27, 1875 with Professor J.C. Corbin in charge of the seven enrolled students. In 1882, the school relocated to a structure erected by state funds on a fifty-acre plot in the suburbs of Pine Bluff. Between 1881 and 1894, the school conferred ten B.A. degrees; the first was conferred in 1882.

In 1927, the Governor appointed an independent Board of Trustees for the college and the state legislature allocated \$275,000 for the construction of new facilities in northern Pine Bluff. To aid this project, the General Education Board contributed \$183,000 and the Rosen Wald Fund \$33,000. From 1927 to 1972, the school was known as Arkansas Agricultural, Mechanical and Normal (AM&N) College. On July 1, 1972, Arkansas AM&N College merged with the University of Arkansas System and was named the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff (UAPB).

While recognizing its historical heritage, UAPB provides higher education today for a diverse student population. Thirty baccalaureate degree programs, eight master's level programs and a doctorate program in Aquaculture/Fisheries are offered through five schools/divisions: the School of Education, the School of Arts and Sciences, the School of Business and Management, the School of Agriculture, Fisheries and Human Sciences and the Division of University College. Three non-degree programs/divisions complete this academic structure: the Carolyn F. Blakely Honors College, Graduate and Continuing Education, and Military Science. Since inception, the University has grown in stature as a center for teaching, research and public service. The University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission. The next review is scheduled in academic year 2016-17.


MISSION STATEMENT





Student Enrollment – Ten Year History – Fall Semesters 2006 to 2015





Historical Enrollment by Gender






Student Enrollment by Fall Semesters






Enrollment by Attendance Status (Fall Semesters)



Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) by Academic Level




Enrollment by Location




Student Semester Credit Hours (SSCH): Distance Education, On- and Off-Campus





Trends in First-Time Full-Time Freshmen Retention and Graduation


First-Year Retention Rates - Ten Year History - Cohorts Fall 2005 to Fall 2014

Six-Year Graduation Rates - Cohorts Fall 2000 to Fall 2009


