Re: Update on Move-In Schedule Due to Winter Weather

We hope that this message finds you safe and warm. As we prepare to welcome you back to campus, we want to inform you of an important update. Due to the Winter Storm Watch issued by the National Weather Service (NWS) we have made the necessary but difficult decision to delay the previously scheduled check-in day. This decision was not taken lightly, and our primary concern is ensuring the safety of our students, their families, and our staff.

We encourage you to monitor weather updates closely and take all necessary precautions if you must travel. Should conditions improve sooner than expected, we will evaluate the situation and communicate any further changes promptly.
