This quick reference guide (QRG) provides instructions on how to view academic progress in Workday. Academic Progress is sometimes referred to as degree progress, a degree audit, or degree requirements. Students should use the Academic Progress screen to evaluate their progress toward their selected degree program and select courses for future academic periods.

To view your academic progress, complete the following steps.



From the Workday Home page:

- 1. Click the Global Navigation Menu.
- 2. Select **Academics Hub**.



- 3. Click the **Academic History** tab.
- 4. Click My Academic Progress.

5. View your **Program Required Units**.
